

1. CAMPBELL RIVER JUNIOR CURLING PROGRAM

EXPECTATIONS OF CURLERS:

Before each game:

Arrive at the rink at least 10 minutes before game time to allow time to change shoes, get a brush, stretch and be ready to go on the ice right at 3:30.

Juniors should only be in the Junior Room to exchange shoes and then leave.

Before going on the ice find a place to sit down and visit quietly with a friend.

Juniors must check their name on the Attendance list and check to see what sheet their game will be on.

At the beginning of each game:

Shake hands with members of the opposing team and wish them good luck.

Someone from each team will do the coin toss to determine who will have last rock in the first end.

During games:

Brushers of the non-throwing team will be at the hogline till it's their turn to brush.

Brushers will have 2 grippers on at all times. A slider will be used for delivery only.

Whoever is throwing next will get their rock ready as soon as the person before them has left the hack.

Only Skips and Thirds are allowed behind the tee-line at the end the play is coming toward. Front end curlers will not be inside the hogline unless delivering their rocks or getting ready to brush a teammate's rock.

If a rock is accidentally touched/burned with either a brush or a foot, the curler will tell their skip what happened and the opposing skip will decide what to do.

Fair play is expected at all times. It is okay to compliment a teammate on a good shot and it is also okay to compliment someone on the other team after a good shot. Good sportsmanship must be demonstrated at all times. Poor sportsmanship could result in a Junior being asked to leave the program.

No food or drinks are to be taken out to the ice.

Curlers must be respectful, cooperative, kind and courteous toward all other curlers and on-ice supervisors at all times

After games:

Curlers will once again shake hands with members of the other team and thank them for the game.

Curlers must be sure they have all their equipment: grippers, sliders, brushes, items of clothing, before heading into Junior Room to change footwear.

If a curler cannot follow the "Expectations" above, a "Junior Curling Incident Form" will be filled out by an on-ice supervisor, describing in detail what has happened, and that information will be reviewed by the Junior Curling Executive. There will be **serious consequences** for any curler unable to follow the expectations listed above.
